The average was taken from the number of children running each day.

In Key Stage 1 Class EFI had the highest average laps per child at ${\bf 3.49}$ but DPA ran the most laps.

In Key Stage 2 Class **DSM** had the highest average laps per child at but **BCL** ran the most laps.

The highest number of laps recorded for a pupil in KS1 was Johnny (EFI) for the boys and Alba (EFI) for the girls. The highest number of laps recorded for a pupil in KS2 was Lucas (AJA) for the boys and Ella (DSM), Bluebelle (AJA) and Emma (DMO).

Year 4/5 Roman Day

This week, our classes stepped back in time to experience life in Ancient Rome! Everyone looked fantastic in their Roman costumes — from emperors and soldiers to goddesses and citizens. The children took part in a range of exciting activities, including drama sessions that brought Roman life to the classroom, learning greetings in Latin and writing their names, and creating beautiful mosaics and laurel wreaths. It was a brilliant day full of creativity, learning, and fun, helping the children to truly understand what life was like in Roman times.

Forest School

This week we have been learning about spiders. Love them or loathe them it is spider season. This week Years 1 and 2 set about creating a spider habitat — a giant leaf spider. After discovering spiders eat bugs we made 'leaf-a-pillers' to feed our own giant leaf spider. Clay spiders were also constructed and set free in the Forest School area ready to be found. Finally, we decorated conkers to look like spiders and added their own silk to hang them up indoors to see if spiders really don't like conkers!
