Have a look at what a fantastic time our year 6's had on their residential to the Ultimate Adventure Centre!















We know that the end of the year and transitioning into a new year group can bring mixed emotions for the children. They are often excited about getting older, moving up to a "bigger" classroom and making new friends but can also be anxious about the change. We have spent a huge amount of time planning for transition this year and we want to share that process with you.

## The children

On Thursday 7th July and Wednesday 13th July, the children will spend the morning with their new teacher in their new classroom. This is really important for children to experience the new environment they will be learning in and spend more time with their new teachers and teaching assistants. This experience always helps the children with any worries they have as the unknowns become known to the children.

Prior to swapping classes, children will watch a video from their new teacher in their current class. They will then have time to discuss how they are feeling before moving on to meet their new teacher for the morning. This year we have added a second morning on Wednesday 13th July to further support the building of positive relationships prior to the summer holidays.

## The staff

As a staff we have been meeting and discussing transition for over two months. When creating new classes, teachers have considered a huge number of factors and it takes hours and hours.

Firstly, we ask the children to name three children they would like to be in a class with next year and we ensure they are with at least one of those friends. We then consider a huge number of other factors but also make sure those classes are as equal as possible. Over more recent weeks, teachers and teaching assistants have been making themselves known to children ahead of the transition mornings to build early relationships.

## Parents and Carers

Now is the perfect time to talk with your child about change and moving on. Ask your child what they are excited about for next year and what they are looking forward to. Also discuss any concerns or worries they have. Often these will be unknowns that will not be worries after they have had their first transition morning to their new teacher. After the first transition morning, ask your child again about what they are excited about and any worries they still have. We will be doing exactly the same at school. You will then find out your child's class teacher the same day as the first transition morning.

We are all really looking forward to meeting our new classes next week and building positive relationships prior to September.

### Dear Parents/Carers,

You will all have received a copy of the new Trust Attendance Policy and a letter from the Trust regarding school attendance.

This policy is partly in response to the impact of Covid and the national lockdowns and the impact this has had on children's learning.

This approach to school attendance will feel very different from the school's current approach.

The main changes to make parents aware of are:

- The school will have a target of 96% +
- All children whose attendance is below 95% will be monitored
- Requests for holiday will only be authorised in exceptional circumstances this is likely to mean almost all requests will be unauthorised
- Any unauthorised holiday taken which results in more than 10 sessions (5 days) absence will result in an automatic referral to the Local Authority who may issue a Fixed Penalty Notice. This is in line with current practice at Park School and many other Devon primaries

We understand that these are huge changes to the way in which we have approached school attendance and particularly absence linked to holiday

All absences related to holiday that have already been authorised at the current time will be honoured but all requests moving forward will be considered under this new policy.

If you would like to discuss this further please contact the school office where the attendance officer will explain this in more detail or make an appointment to see Ms Warner who will be able to talk through the implications of these changes. We are keen to work with you during this period of transition so please do not hesitate to make contact.
