# **Topic and Trips**

This term our topic is driven by the enquiry question, 'Why do people choose to live in cities?' This is a Geography based topic in which the children will think about the human geography side focusing on different types of settlements and cities in particular. The children will think about what a city is, what makes up a city and why people choose to or choose not to live in cities. We will focus this around a case study looking at Bristol in more depth. As part of this learning, we are hoping to visit Bristol to put our learning in context.

We are also hoping to have a visit from the Sciencedipity to support the Year 3 and 4's with their science units this term. We are trying to keep costs to a minimum and it is estimated that the cost for both events will be around £17.50 per child. We will send further details out about this nearer the time.



# **Library Books**

Thank you for your support with keeping the library and classroom books safe and well cared for. The children love their visits to the library and take a real pleasure in choosing their next book!

#### **Home Learning**

It is expected that children read out loud <u>every day</u>. This is essential as it develops their accuracy, fluency and confidence in reading aloud. It is also a fabulous chance to question them on what they have read - a key skill for reading!

We will continue to set home learning in their home learning books. The home learning will have a focus on a times table for that week, some hooking back to what they have done in their maths lessons each week and some key spellings to practice. Home learning will be set on a Friday, with an expectation that it is completed by the following Wednesday. We will then go through the home work each week in class before the Friday.
