[Holiday Activity and Food \(HAF\) programme](#)

The aim of the [Holiday Activity and Food \(HAF\) programme](#) is to support children to eat more healthily, be more active over the school holidays and have a greater knowledge of health and nutrition as well as be more engaged with school and other local services.

Is my child eligible?

Priority places will be given to:

- children aged 5-16 years (including 4-year-olds if in reception) who are eligible for and receiving benefit related free school meals, and their families
- friends of the above – if it encourages the free school meal children to attend

Extended Eligibility Criteria:

Our providers can choose to use up to 15% of their funding towards providing free or subsidised holiday club places for children who are not in receipt of benefits-related free school meals. This includes:

- children assessed by the local authority as being in need, at risk or vulnerable (for example, children on a Child Protection Plan, Children in Need or on an Early Help plan)
- young carers
- looked-after children or previously looked after children
- children with an EHC (education, health and care) plan
- children who have low attendance rates at school or who are at risk of exclusion
- children living in areas of high deprivation or from low-income households who are not in receipt of free school meals
- children in transition phases between nursery and primary school or primary and secondary school
