



Coronavirus (COVID-19) catch-up premium

This is a universal one-off grant of £80 per pupil in reception to year 11. It is allocated for the academic year 2020 to 2021 to all schools to help pupils make up for lost teaching time.

This statement sets out how **Sticklepath Community Primary Academy** intends to use its COVID-19 catch-up.
